




ASEAN Dialogue Partners Trust Fund

- 1. Established to fund activities that promote cooperation between ASEAN and various Dialogue Partners.
- 2. Most of the trust funds are non-sectoral specific and ASEAN Secretariat is entrusted to administer.
- 3. The administration of these funds is guided by a set of Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) approved by the Committee of Permanent Representatives to ASEAN (CPR).
- 4. Priority for funding is generally determined by common and agreed-upon priorities of ASEAN and the Dialogue Partner.
- 5. The ASEAN-ROK Special Cooperation Fund (ARSCF) is in the process of merging with other ROK supported fund into a new trust fund, the ASEAN-ROK Cooperation Fund (AKCF).

ASEAN Cooperation Project Proposal: Format

- 1. **Project Details** (title, description, classification, duration, participating AMS, sponsoring ASEAN body, proponent, implementing agency, proposed funding source, proposed budget)
- 2. Project Justification, Regionality and Beneficiaries (current problem, why the need for regional action, project history)
- 3. Project Results (indicators, means of verification)
- 4. Project Management Arrangement (human resource inputs, M&E)
- 5. Project Sustainability Gender and Other Cross-cutting Issues
- 6. Potential Risks

With 3 annexes: budget proposal, indicative work plan, notation on additional suporting documents



ASEAN Cooperation Project Proposal: Appraisal (1)

- **1. Regionality:** The problem is regional and not national by definition; which means that the problem exist beyond the national level
 - The problem requires cooperation in order to bring about a solution; a regional problem which requires regional cooperation to solve
- **2. Description:** Can the given brief project description capture the essence of the project proposal?
- **3. Objective:** Is the objective(s) clear, achievable and measurable? For a recurring project, is the objective(s) still relevant with the current ASEAN context?
- 4. Outputs, Indicators and Activities
 - Will the outputs ensure the attainment of the objective(s)?
 - Will the activities produce the outputs?
 - Are the proposed input(s) sufficient to achieve outputs?
 - For a recurring project, is the output(s) still relevant with the current ASEAN context?



ASEAN Cooperation Project Proposal: Appraisal (2)

- **5. Management and Implementation Arrangements:** Are the management and implementation arrangements realistically defined?
- 6. Budget Proposal:
 - Do the activities appear to be cost-efficient in general? (activities that are too expensive compared to the results we are hoping for is not good value for money)
 - Do the activities comply with the ASEAN project budget guidelines? (the allocated DSA and its allocation should be in line with ASEC/ ASEC – DP/ DP's policy on standard DSA and standard practice for hotel and per diem)
 - Does the budget provide a clear breakdown with clear basis, assumptions, and calculation?
- **7. Indicative Work Plan:** Are the activity(s) and the timeline in the indicative work plan sufficiently realistic to achieve the intended output(s)?
