FOREWORD

1. Introduction

This book and the teacher's manual are for Grade 2.

2. Organization of the Book

The book contains 21 lessons including 21 structural items. Illustrations are provided for the words and sentences in each lesson. So, students can easily understand and enjoy these lessons. The English numerals 1 to 10 in rember as well as in words are given with respective picture illustrations.

At the end of the lessons, songs and rhymes are given for students' pleasure and oral fluency.

3. Objectives

All pupils must be taught and trained to be able to:

- (1) know and recognize the basic sentence patterns,
- (2) read aloud for correct pronunciation and correct stress, rhythm and intonation, and comprehension,
- (3) develop clear, well-formed and fluent handwriting and
- (4) read and write the English numerals 1 to 10.

Note:

- (1) Attention should be given on reading aloud.
- (2) Must pay constant attention to the teaching and training of handwriting.
- (3) Do the given exercises orally several times before asking the students to write.

4. Time Allocation

For Grade 2, the number of periods per week allocated to English is 4. Since the total number of actual teaching weeks in one academic year is 36, distribution of time will be 144 periods and 72 hours for the whole text.
